Implementing the Sports Premium Funding at Newberries Primary School

As a school we have always placed a great emphasis on PE and are proud of our overall provision and rate of participation in competitive events. Newberries will continue to develop competence in a broad range of physical activities. We will continue to ensure that the children are given opportunities throughout their time in our school to engage in a range of competitive sports and activities supporting the children in leading healthy and active lives.

The additional funding, which will run for 2016/17 (approximately £8,800), will allow us to:

- Provide extra-curricular activites and clubs in a range of sports, provided by specialist coaches (football, dodgeball, cricket, athletics, gymnastics).(£1600)
- Pay for affiliation to Watford and Hertsmere Schools Sports Partnership (WHSSP) which facilitates local inter-school competitions and professional development opportunities for teachers. (£5400)
 - 1. The increased package gives us access to high quality specialist teachers who are able to deliver CPD and lessons directly to children across all year groups.
 - 2. Access to CPD provision for teaching staff in a range of sports and activities.
 - 3. Access to external CPD provision for auxiliary staff for things such as lunchtime activities and play leader training.
 - 4. Year 4 children can access training to help them become PlayBuddies upon entering Year 5.
 - Be used to establish a range of intra-school competitions to take place at regular intervals during the school year for all age ranges from Foundation, through KS1 to KS2.

In this way, our children will gain new skills and experiences and teachers will learn new techniques and knowledge to aid them in teaching sport and PE. The children will also develop skills to use in the future and also the spirit of competitive fair play.

The long term aim is higher quality lessons and improved learning for all children.
