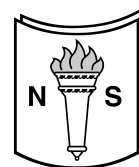

Pupil Premium Funding



Pupil Premium Funding Plan – 2015-16

- At the start of the 2015-16 financial year the school received a Pupil Premium grant of £14,520 for those pupils eligible. A further £3,960 Pupil Premium Grant was received during the year.
- We propose the funding will be used to support these pupils by:
- Funding a qualified Intervention Teacher to run either individual or group intervention to address any gaps in learning for these pupils;
- Funding a qualified Intervention Teacher to run either individual or group sessions to enable higher ability pupils to exceed in targeted expectations;
- Providing 1:1 sessions for pupils with social and emotional difficulties, intervention will address needs like anger management, self-regulation, and friendships and will be carried out using the arts.
- Providing focus children with appropriate targeted therapies (Art Therapy, Play Therapy, Counselling Services) to support emotional development.
- Ensuring that pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium are financially supported to access additional opportunities as required.
- Ensuring teachers are focusing on the progress and attainment of Pupil Premium children and have this as part of Pupil Progress Meetings.
- Purchasing ICT resources to further support targeted pupils.
- Purchasing manipulatives to support the teaching of Maths for targeted pupils throughout school.

Impact:

- The vast majority of Pupil Premium children reached or exceeded age related expectations:

	Reading	Writing	Maths
% Reaching Age Related Expectations	92%	77%	77%

- In school data shows that the majority of pupils who have received additional intervention have made at least good progress with many making accelerated progress:

	Reading	Writing	Maths
% Making Expected Progress +	85%	85%	85%

- External agencies used to support targeted pupils have been used successfully to enable further access to the curriculum.
- Extended opportunities were offered to those pupils who it was deemed.
- Whole school attendance is good. Support in place for the most vulnerable children has ensured that, not only are all the children able to attend residential trips, our Pupil Premium children did so.
