

Curriculum Leaflet – Year 2

Spring Term 2018

Year 2 will be following the 2014 National Curriculum alongside Hertfordshire's own schemes for RE and Computing.

English

- Reading and writing stories with recurring language.
- Study of That Rabbit Belongs to Emily Brown and other texts.
- Traditional tales – Myths.
- Poetry - Read, write and perform free verse.
- Writing instructions.
- Writing reports and explanations linked to our topic. - Assemble information on a subject, sorting and categorising information; use comparative language to describe and differentiate
- Children will focus on skills of writing which includes:
 - Writing a grammatically correct sentence
 - Sentences with different forms : statement, question, exclamation, command.
 - Sentences which include expanded noun phrases to describe specify.
- Handwriting,
- Spellings- Phase 5 and 6.

Maths

- Place value: ordering 2-digit numbers; additions and subtractions
- Revise number bonds to 10; begin to bridge 10; subtract from 10 and 20
- Recognise and identify properties of 3D shapes.
- Tell the time to the nearest quarter on analogue and digital clocks
- Order 2-digit numbers and revise the < and > signs;
- Round 2-digit numbers to nearest 10
- Revise doubles and corresponding halves to 15
- Revise and recognise 1/2s, 1/4s, 1/3s and 2/3s of shapes
- Count in 2s, 5s and 10s to solve multiplication problems; arrange objects into arrays and write the corresponding multiplications; make links between grouping and multiplication to begin to show division
- Recognise all coins, know their value, and use them to make amounts; recognise £5, £10, £20 notes; make amounts using coins and £10 note.



Science

1st Half – Animals and their Habitat.

2nd Half - Forces and Movement (How pushes and pulls affect the shape and *shape and movement of objects*)

Topic

With the introduction of the New Curriculum, Newberries is taking a cross curricular approach to teaching the skills. This will be taught through 'Topics'. Each Term a new topic will be introduced to the class.

The theme of the topic for this Spring term is:

AN ISLAND HOME

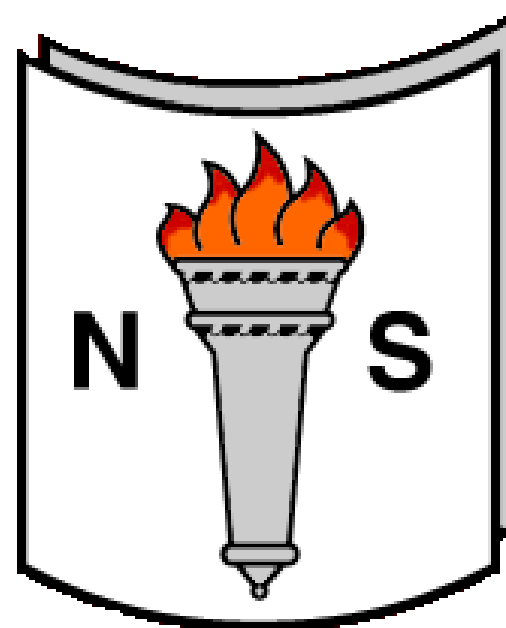
