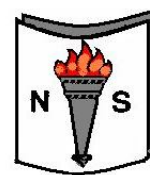

Handwriting and Presentation Policy

This policy is an addition to the English Policy

AIMS

- Promote consistency of handwriting and presentation throughout the school.
- Promote children's sense of pride in their own work.
- Encourage children to acquire correct letter formation and clear, legible, joined handwriting.

TEACHING AND LEARNING

The teaching of handwriting and other presentation techniques will enhance children's work in other curriculum areas.

All classes will have regular sessions devoted to the teaching of handwriting and presentation.

Teaching should:

- Follow the chosen agreed cursive script (see Appendix 1).
- Ensure the children see effective demonstration and modelling of letter formation and joins through teaching inputs and in general writing on the whiteboards.
- Handwriting should be taught in conjunction with spelling to reinforce the link between letter formation and phonetical awareness.
- Give children in Reception to Year 6 the opportunity for at least one taught handwriting session per week followed by regular practise in handwriting books.
- Give children in Reception to Year 6 the opportunities to practice and develop handwriting and presentation skills in all areas of the curriculum, as appropriate.
- Allow opportunities for children to practise handwriting alongside teacher demonstrations, rather than just copying from sheets or schemes.
- Introduce blue pens during Year 4 and ensure that pens are used consistently in written work in Key Stage 2.
- Handwriting pens available for children as appropriate.

Presentation

All children will be encouraged to put clear titles and dates on all written work.

		One digit in each square
	Science	Use pencil for diagrams but pen for writing labels
	Pen	All children from Year 4 to write in pen when consistent cursive script is used.
	Erasers	No ink erasers to be used
